**Reuse**

**Recycle**

**Reduce** the amount of solid waste that you have to pay for by composting. Commercial composters are available, but they can be made easily out of pallets. The library has information on how to compost.

**Reuse** – Take unwanted but still usable items to the swap shop at the transfer station. Items may be dropped off or taken at no charge. There will be a charge for appliances or furniture that no one takes. Check with the attendant when dropping off 5 bags or more, or large items.

**Recycle** – The recycling center accepts the following items for disposal at no cost. Please place in the appropriate receptacle at the transfer station.



### Glass

Containers must be clean and not broken. Lids must be removed

**YES:**  
glass food jars  
glass beverage jars  
drinking glasses  
ceramics, crystal,  
vases

**NO:**  
light bulbs  
container lids  
window glass (demolition)



### Aluminum

**YES:**  
cans  
foil products

### Metal

No need to separate aluminum and tin at the transfer station - put in either bin

Aluminum cans. Items must be clean and free of food residue. Aluminum will not stick to a magnet.

**NO:**  
cookware (scrap metal)  
aerosol cans (scrap metal)

### Tin

**YES:**  
tin cans with lids  
metal jars with lids  
beer bottle caps

Must be clean with labels removed

**NO:**  
propane bottles  
gas cans  
scrap metal  
aerosol cans



### Plastics 1-8

If your plastic container has a triangle, and any number from 1-8, it can be recycled.

**YES:**  
milk jugs,  
yogurt containers,  
salad greens containers  
bleach bottles

**NO:**  
no styrofoam  
no flimsy plastic bags  
no automobile oil bottles that have oil remaining  
no plastic toys



### Paper Products

Most paper products can be recycled, but go into 3 different bins at the transfer station.

### Corrugated

**YES:**  
empty corrugated cardboard  
brown paper bags

Corrugated boxes must be clean, dry, and flattened

**NO:**  
waxed, wet, or painted cardboard  
oriental (yellow) cardboard  
non-paper packing materials

### Newspapers & Magazines

**YES:**  
newspapers + inserts  
magazines  
catalogs  
phone books

Materials should be dry, and not tied.

**NO:**  
hardback books  
paperback books  
brown or manila envelopes  
string

### Mixed Paper & Cereal Box Type

**YES:**  
cereal boxes  
paper towel rolls  
toilet paper rolls  
orange juice containers  
mail, office paper

Must be clean and dry, any plastic or metal removed
