



Meeting Minutes 07/03/2017

1. Composting:

- a. Although we haven't completed our survey of major food producers, all are either doing it partially now or are receptive to it.
- b. Mark King has confirmed that brown napkins are compostable but would have to experiment with the waxed deli paper (Sand Bar and Gawker).
- c. Anna will keep working with Mark and start talking about when he might come out.

2. Website:

- a. Jocelyn has made the changes that we asked for.
- b. Pat updated the pricing pages, and saved them as two documents (one on what to recycle, the other on prices), put it back in color for Jocelyn to post. Kenny was given the recycling page to approve; he had no changes. Pat forgot to ask him who his contacts are; Gabe will do that this week.

3. Layout:

- a. Pat was supposed to have a 3-dimensional plot for the meeting but didn't get it done. Del offered to do this (with an assistant), and then suggested working with Wes Robinson who has some technology that can do it even better. Not sure if this will be ready for next week.
- b. Kenny had mentioned that 25% of dump customers go to demolition. If that is the case, it would be no improvement on congestion if people still had to go to two different places every time they came to the dump.
  - i. Survey
    1. We are thinking of taking a Sunday (another one!) and ing the traffic for a day – see how much of that really goes to demolition
    2. If we worked as a team, one person could also be talking to the trash throwers, asking if they compost at home, if food waste is in their trash bags.
  - ii. Again, if true, the scale is critical to getting paid for what is thrown away. Metal should be weighed as well.
- c. Can we do trash at ground level? We've been working on the assumption that we have to be able to throw it over the top of an open bin, but single stream on North Haven is at ground level. Can trash be done the same way??? Gabe to ask???
